Rules & Regulations

The Cygnet Dressage Show will be conducted in accordance with the current Equine Canada Rule Book. It is the responsibility of the competitors and horse owners to be aware of the rules contained in the CEF Rule Book. The SPHC and the organizing committee reserve the right to decide any point not covered by these rules.

If memberships are required visit www.equinecanada.ca for your bronze licence .

Every horse must wear its competition number for the duration of the show whenever it leaves the stall. Failure to do so will result in a warning for the first offense and possible elimination from competition for subsequent offenses.

All mounted riders are required to wear a secured ASTM/SEI approved safety helmet at all times on the show grounds.

Competitors entering the show ring outside of posted times will be eliminated.
Scoring area and judges' booth are off limits except to show officials.

Do not approach the judges' booth during competition.

Inhumane treatment of horses will result in disqualification. Please refer to Equine Canada rule book.

No horse may be ridden by any other rider entered in the competition on that particular horse. Failure to comply will result in elimination of that horse. Please refer to Equine Canada Rule book.

Show goes rain or shine.

Lunging only in designated area.

Arena available Friday 5 pm – 9 pm.

STABLE RULES

Box stalls are available for \$40.00 per stall for the show. Cleaning deposit of \$50.00 (separate cheque) is required and will be returned after inspection of the stall by the barn manager shows that it has been cleaned. Please see barn manager for stall assignments and refunds. **Stalls will be available from noon on Friday June 17, 2011 to Sunday 7 p.m. June 19, 2011. Competitors must provide own feed . Bedding provided. There are no tack stalls available.**

Horses must be stabled in assigned stalls only.

Horse trailers will be parked in designated area.

The show committee reserves the right to remove any horse and/or rider from the competition at any time without being liable for compensation.

Absolutely **NO SMOKING** in stabling area.

Competitors are responsible for keeping the area in front of their stall clean for the duration of the show.
Competitors are required to clean their stall after the show.

Dirty bedding will be dumped in areas provided for this.

All dogs must be kept on a leash at all times.

Juniors riding stallions must be aware of Art.E.7.11.6 Equine Canada rules.

Freestyle

Music for freestyle must be recorded on a CD, clearly labeled with name and class and any necessary instructions. CD's must be submitted to the show office at time of registration.

Entry Information

Entries must be post marked no later than June 3, 2011. No phone or fax entries will be accepted. Show committee reserves the right to limit entries to 64 tests per day, entries accepted 1st come 1st served. **Entries received after the 64 tests will be placed on waiting list.**

Make entry fees payable to the SPHC and include them with your entry form. Entries are not considered valid until they are paid in full.

There will be no refund of entry fees after the official entry closing date of the show except with a vet or doctors certificate. The administration will not be refunded for any reason. Competitors are responsible for the correctness of their entries.

Every competitor must hold current EC Bronze or higher Sport Licence. Every horse owner if different from the rider, must also hold current EC Bronze or higher Sport Licence.

No horse may be entered in two levels of freestyles at the same competition, nor in a level of freestyle either higher or lower then the highest level the rider is competing in.

More than one competitor may ride the same pony/horse providing the pony/horse is not entered by two riders in the same class & the pony/horse may not be in more than four tests per day. One competitor may ride more than one horse.

The Junior category is open to all riders 16 and under as of January 1, 2011.

The OPEN category is open to all riders regardless of age or status.

Junior riders can ride either category in a division, but not both.

Riders can ride two consecutive tests per day, plus freestyle.

All competitors must sign the release and acknowledgement of risk form. Riders under 18 must have a parent or guardian signature.

Please complete the stabling information form and include it with your entry form.

Riding times will be e-mailed or phoned by June 16, 2011.

Protests have to be made in writing within 48 hrs. of the competition and must be accompanied with \$100.00.

The SPHC Cygnet Dressage Show is a competition of Equine Canada and is governed by the rules of Equine Canada. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of Equine Canada and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.

The Equine Canada (EC), the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.

Equine Canada is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors, and their agents use responsible care in the handling treatment and transportation of their horse as well as horses placed in their care for a purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horse by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices.
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition.
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

- (iii) The equine’s response to certain hazards such as surface and subsurface objects;
- (iv) Collisions with other equines, animals, people and objects;
- (v) The potential of a participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or others, such as failing to maintain control over the equine or to act within his or her ability.

Neither the Equine Canada, the South Peace Horse Club (SPHC) and its directors, Evergreen Park, the Cygnet Dressage Show, the organizing committee of the show, officials, volunteers, staff, nor agents shall in any way be liable for any accident, injury, damage, loss or for any other matter that may happen to exhibitors, competitors, owners, agents or to anyone on the grounds or to any animal or article brought to the grounds. Music must be recorded onto a CD that can be played on a regular CD player. Please put your name and test level on the CD. It is highly recommended to bring a back up CD with you as well.

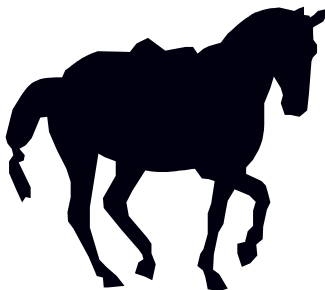
You can only do a freestyle at the same level that you are competing during the show.

P.R.A.D.A. – Peace Region Alberta Dressage Association Awards Criteria

1. The award year includes competitions between January 1 and December 31. Each year is a new award year.
2. To be eligible for year-end awards, horse owners and/or exhibitors must be current members in good standing of P.R.A.D.A. (Exception: Volunteer of the Year)
3. Horses and ponies must be owned or leased by a member in good standing of P.R.A.D.A. in the year that the scores are earned.
4. If the horse is owned or leased by several individuals (e.g. a stable, farm, or corporation, at least one of the principals must be a member in good standing of P.R.A.D.A. in the year that the scores are earned).
5. Only shows entered after the membership date will be counted. Memberships will not be retroactive for the purpose of accumulating points.
6. Same horse/rider combination, you may have more than one horse/rider combination as you may be riding more than one horse.
7. Qualifying scores as per current EC Rule Book.
8. The horse/rider combination must acquire a minimum of four scores from at least two different P.R.A.D.A. sanctioned bronze level dressage shows.
9. When more than one judge is present, the average score of the two will be counted.
10. High Point awards are based on scores earned in one level (freestyles not included).
11. Levels at which High Point awards will be presented are: Walk/Trot (Open & Junior), Training (Open & Junior), First Level (Open), Second Level (Open), Third Level (Open)
12. High Point will be calculated based on the average of the top two test scores earned at P.R.A.D.A. sanctioned bronze level dressage shows.
13. In the event that there is a tie, the average will then be calculated using the average of the top three test scores earned.
14. Other awards will be given out as follows, as decided on by the Year End Awards Committee; please contact the committee for criteria for these categories;
 - i) Highest average score for each test

- ii) Overall Highest Level score
- iii) Highest Score Freestyle (not averaged)
- iv) Most improved rider
- v) Most improved horse
- vi) Sportsmanship
- vii) Draw Prize (name gets entered once for every class entered, this includes schooling shows sanctioned by P.R.A.D.A)
- viii) Hard Luck Award
- ix) Volunteer of the Year

15. The awards committee reserves the right to break any ties encountered.

16. Prizes will be given out as decided on by the Year End Awards Committee and may change from year to year.

17. Scores will be submitted by each show; no application is necessary.
